Wear it Pink Day – Friday 20th October

On Friday 20th October, students are encouraged to take part in Wear it Pink day, to raise money for Breast Cancer Now.



Breast Cancer Now is the UK's largest breast cancer charity and is dedicated to funding research into the disease. Breast Cancer Now's ambition is that by 2050 no one will die from the disease. The charity is currently funding around £23 million worth of ground-breaking research projects, supporting nearly 450 of the world's brightest researchers at more than 30 institutions across the UK and Ireland.

Every year Wear it Pink raises around £2 million during Breast Cancer Awareness Month by asking people to wear something pink and donate whatever they can. Since the very first Wear it Pink event in 2002, over £28 million has been raised thanks to the generosity of the many thousands of people taking part.

If your child would like to support this worthy charity they need to bring £1 to school if they choose to wear something pink.

Please note that:

- no jeggings are to be worn
- no high heels
- students must wear normal school uniform apart from the pink item.

Any students not dressed appropriately for Wear it Pink day will be sent home to change.

On the day there will also be a small bake sale and a smoothie sale to raise awareness, money and to have fun!
