<p>Tragedy</p>	<p>A very sad event or situation, especially one involving death or suffering or a play about death and suffering.</p> <p>Romeo and Juliet is a tragedy play written by William Shakespeare. It is also a tragedy in that there are characters who suffer and died throughout the entirety of the play.</p>			
<p>Conflict</p>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Conflict is an argument or disagreement between a set of people. 2. An active disagreement between people with opposite ideas or principles. 3. Fighting between two or more groups of people or countries. <p>In Romeo and Juliet, many of the main characters experience conflict through family feuds or older family ties which are difficult to break.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">Literacy Focus</p> 	<p>Full stops (.) Full stops should always be used at the end of a sentence and should always be followed by a capital letter.</p> <p>Capital letters (C) Capital letters should be used for all proper nouns (names, countries, books and TV shows)</p> <p>Exclamation marks (!) Exclamation marks are used to show a word, phrase or sentence is an exclamation.</p> <p>Semi-colon (;) The semi-colon is used to indicate a pause, typically between two main clauses. This is more pronounced than a comma.</p>
