

WHAT IS 'FAKE NEWS'?

Fake news can be false information, photos or videos purposefully created to confuse or misinform. It can also be genuine information that has been manipulated to deceive. It is important that we learn how to distinguish between real news and fake news.



Keywords

FAKE NEWS	Fabricated news/false stories
BIASED	one sided opinion
CREDIBLE	believable based on evidence. Convincing.
FACT	Something proven to be true
CYBER BULLYING	Bullying someone uses the internet or digital device to threaten, abuse or tease someone.
CYBER STALKING	Repeatedly sending messages that include threats of harm.
FLAMING	Causing online fights using electronic devices with angry and vulgar language.
OUTING/TRICKERY	Sharing someone's secrets or embarrassing information online.
SEXTING	Sending explicit images via a digital device
SEXTORTION	Threats to expose a sexual image in order to make a person do something or for revenge.
PEER PRESSURE	Being influenced by member of the same peer group.
PHISHING	Fake emails that contain viruses or spyware
SHOULDERING	Looking over someone's shoulder to gain information.

What is Pharming?

Fraudsters hijack a website's domain name and use it to redirect visitors to an imposter site.

SCAM'S OBJECTIVE: To intercept and steal online payments.

Check that the URL of any site asking for data is authentic - look for the secure certificate.
